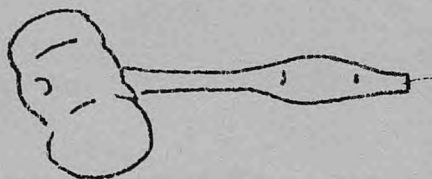
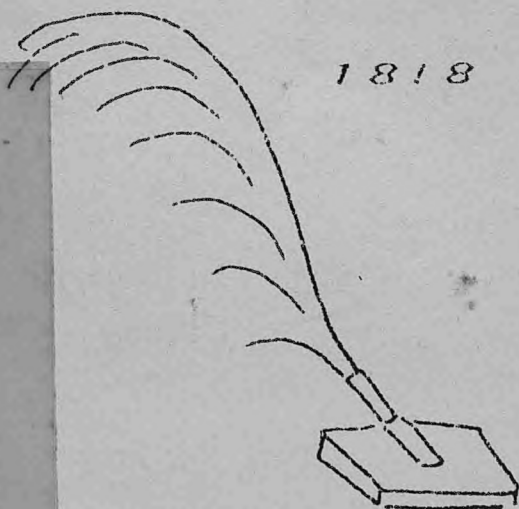

LETTERS AND APPRENTICESHIPS
1818 - 1840

- 1 Nov.9,1818.. Silas SHIRLY, infant son of Charles Shirly, he having reaches the age of eleven years of age, on the 11th day of December past, is hereby bound by his guardian, Nicholas PROCTOR unto Joseph JOLLY/TOLLY?? for the purpose of learning the trade of wheelwright, which he the said JOLLY useth. And as an apprentice to dwell and to serve him from this day of date until the said Silas reaches the age of twenty one years to be completed and ended, and during all which term the said apprentice shall serve his secrets, keep his lawful command, every whim obey, hurt to his said master he shall not do as nor to suffer it to be done by others..but of the same to his power..to his said master shall for the--- give notice the goods of his master, he shall not embezzle, nor them lend without his masters consent...at cards, dice or any other unlawful game he shall not frequent, fornication he shall not. matrimony he shall not contract from the service of his said master leave. But in all things as a good and a faithful apprentice shall demeaned and behave himself towards his master.. and the said JOLLY his said apprentice the trade service and or occupation of a wheelwright, shall teach and instruct or cause the same to be taught in the best manner he can..he shall unto his said apprentice good wholesome meat drink, washing, lodging and apparrel cloth linen and woölen and the necessaries for and convenient for such an apprentice and also within the said term teach or cause to be taught his apprentice reading, writing and common arithmetic including the rules of three.

What she doesn't need to be sold..Likewise leaves to wife what money I have here and what money in the settle and the

Money when collected to be let out on interest. The interest is to be paid yearly or as the executors can agree. If insufficient she is to take some principal during her life or widowhood. The balance is to be divided equally among all my children. He does appoint sons executors.. John and Andrew Johnson.

Appointed as executors Verlinda Ray and James L. Ray..letters were granted to them at Franklin Missouri 28 December 1820. Will of John Ray.. All of my property real and personal to my wife Verlinda Ray., for her use during her natural life. Grants the wife power to sell, convey, exchange the two tracts of land and several lots of ground within the county. Gives her choice of one Negro slave..only one out of all. Also her choice of one cow, horse, feather beds and bedding.. She may dispose of the rest as she pleases. Executors are to sell Negro woman Sarah and ner child or any other of the slaves,,the money to be used for the debts. After her death the balance of the personal property to be divided among the children equally.

31 Executors are to convey to Burket D. Bomer the one half of my two tracts of land by paying for the same. If any of the children marry before the decease of the wife, then she will be in lieu of so much of the share to which would have been entitled after the decease of the wife..in no case is she to give unequal shares.. it is his intention all shall inherit equally. Appoints wife, Verlinda and Benjamin Ray as the executors.. Signed.. 12 October 1820 St. Louis.. Witnesses: Benjamin Cooper and Daniel Munroe Jr. and William Lucas.

33 Last Will of William Chisam..
Buried at the discretion of my executors. First, I give my brother, Walter Chisam my two broadcloth coats..one brown and the other blue. I also give and bequeath my half of what ever balance may be due from James Dow, the "Taylor" of Franklin to myself and Julius Howard, who have equal partners in the trade of cabinet makers and also my half of the tools consisting of planes, chisels, saws and all other implements of the trade belonging to the shop of Chisham and Howard.. these to my partner Julius Howard. It is my will that my executors sell on the best terms they can my half of a lot situated in Franklin which I hold in partnership with Eph-riam Morely..This lot purchased by Morely and myself of Robert Morris (Robert W. Morris) this amount arising to be put toward my debts. Any money arising out of business owed will be put to that use also. The furniture and materials on hand may be sold also for that purpose. Any wearing apparel that need to be sold should be, if none need be the clothing to be given to his mother and father. My horse, a sorrel shall be sold if necessary by the executors to be applied toward the debts,,if not necessary the horse goes to his parents as well as any balance of the estate.

"In the name of God, Amen. Calling into mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men to die do make and ordain this to be my last will and tesatement, that is to say principally and first of all I give and recommend my soul unto the hand of the Almighty God that gave it and my body. To recommed. to the earth to be buried in a decent Christian manner nothing doubting but at the general reserrection I shall receieve the same again by the power of God, as and touching such wordly goods wherein it has pleased God to bless me in this life"...To wife...to pay all debts by hiring out my negroes...Wife, Jane Rollins, three negro boys, Pompy, Peter and Easter, together with all my stock of horses, cattle and hogs, farming utensils, household and kitchen furniture to be hers during her natural life. At her death to be divided among equally my last six children.. To son Thomas Rollins a negro girl names Siller??, one bed and bed --- and furniture, horse and saddle. To daughter Mary --ush, one negro woman named Liddy along with her bed and furniture(Marys). To son Benjamin Rollins one negro boy named Hiram, a horse and saddle, bed and the furniture. To son Levy Rollins, a negro boy named Sam, his horse, bed and furniture. To son John Rollins a negro boy named Bill, his horse, bed and furniture. To son Owen Rollins, a negro boy named ---, his horse, bed and furniture. I also do bequeath to my six last children namely.. James D. Rollins, Nancy Rollins, William Rollins, Jane Rollins, Elvira Rollins, and ----- Rollins all the rest of my negres namely Joe, Dacy, Milly, Harrison, Squire and Andy.As they come of age let them have a negro, horse and saddle, bed and furniture, and when the youngest comes of age let the last six named negrees be divided amongst my last six children. I also leave to my sons James D. Rollins and William Rollins (youngest sons) that 75 acres that was purchased of Irwine to be divided between them equally. Signed: 13 January 1820

Also to the daughter of Jabez Hubbard, Anne Elizabeth Hink Hubbard and to Thomas Jackson Hubbard, my negro man named Dennis. The balance to be divided among my sons and my wife Nancy. Sons are.. Thomas, Hugh and Francis. My oldest son Thomas has a quarter section of land patented in his name but paid for by me which is to be deducted from his balance of the estate, or he is to put it with the balance of the estate and take equal portion with his two brothers. As it is my intention to provide comfortably for my wife as long as she lives and then to divide my estate between my three sons. My daughter Mary Leverage being already provided for. As to the money that may arise from the sale of any part of my estate should my wife be disposed of to sell, that is my stock, household or kitchen furniture it is to be put with as such that can be collected and divided among four parts, reserving enough buy the youngest son as much stock as the other sons have.

None is to loaned out on interest in safe hands. The interest which is to be at the disposal of herself and the principal with all that part of my estate reserved for her is to be equally divided at her death among my three sons. My oldest son has his stock marked in his own mark and my second son Hugh, his stock is not separated distinguishably from others than by the knowledge of the family and perhaps some of the neighbors. Hugh therefore is to have the privilege of the separating that part of the stock owned by him from mine.
