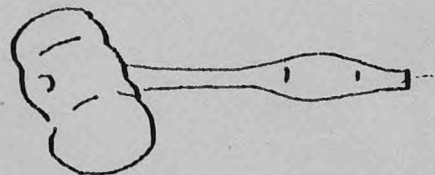
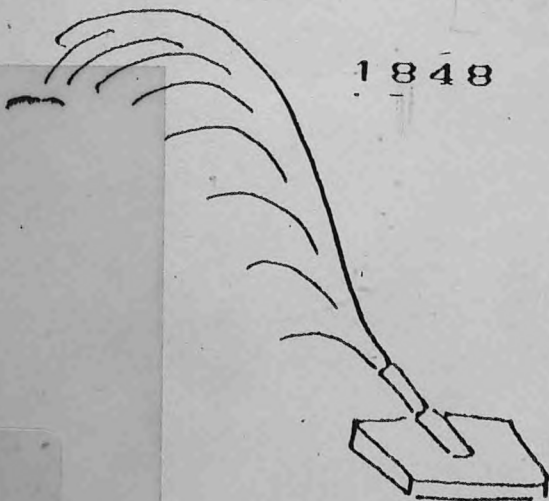

Jane to have all household and kitchen furniture, and the large salt kettle
All slaves with the exception of Lucy, Green and the yellow girl Harriett to be divided among my children or their heirs. The children or their heirs to have all the real estate lying in Cooper County, the same for the remainder of the personal property not already bequeathed.
So that Mary Ann Hughes the daughter of Jeremiah Hughes dec'd may be made equal with my other children, I give her the girl Harriett and N.T. Mitchells note, Wm.D. Basketts note, Elisha Hughes note, ..

"Now for the reason I have for assigning all my estate except half of the farm after her death is this, She has done a good --- procuring the said property, secondly; she has been to me a kind and affectionate wife and lastly though not least she has bequeathed to me a handsome maintenance provided I should be the longest liver..these are my reasons for doing so".. Son Joshua Hobbs to act as executor

Burroughs during her natural life the farm on which I now reside (description given) 94 acres, cattle, oxen, waggon, harness, farming utensils and horses, sheep and hogs for which she may deem necessary to run the farm, household and kitchen furniture, my cupboard ware and my negroes Daniel, William and Nicy, wife to have absolutely my girl Harriett and 300.00.. to my daughter Mary Jane Hughes two of my negroes Ellen and James.. at the death of my wife Nancy, I give to my youngest son Davenport Burroughs my home place on which I now reside.. appoints my two oldest sons James Madison Burroughs and Thomas Pendleton Burroughs my executors.
(No date for will shown) Roland Hughes and Allen Hughes witnessed.

To my sons Milton James and Garland as trustees for my daughter Mary
Crews, I give the negro girls Rachel and Franky, plus 100.00 worth of
household and kitchen furniture, all this in her possession now and for
her use and after her death to her children.. trustees full power to
manage her property and all other she may get under this will.
(States that Milton and James have already rec'd money) Milton to have
property in Howard County (description given) (Milton G.) This is the
tract where he now resides. To son James G., land 110 acres (description
given) this purchased from William Perkins.
To my sons Milton James and Garland in trust for my son William during
his life the negro boy Walker aged about 18 years and 600.00, the slave
to be used by William under the direction of the trustees and the money
put to interest and if necessary the principal to be used for his support.
If this insufficient then to be provided for from estate. If William
should die with no descendants the his portion to other children.
To son Garland lands(198 acres purchased of A.E. Hubbard, plus 50 acres
of white oak land (descriptions) ..son Garland shall live with his mother
during her life and for this I give 1/3 rd part of the tillable land
where I now live and 1 room in the house and all outbuildings as he may
need and the right to use timber for firewood.. he to also have a negro
boy John aged about 7 years.
Sons Milton, James and Garland appointed as trustees for daughters Tabitha
Gates, Malinda Crews and Martha Vincent and Mary Crews.. at death of wife
and all property not already disposed of equally divided with the excep-
tion of William who has already been provided for.

To my wife Phebe H. Cooper, the farm home on which I now live. (description given) 160 acres, with all farming tools, horses, cattle, and all stock what ever. All furniture and utensils belonging to the house. He also gives Phebe another tract in Howard County. From this estate she to except all the beds and the bedding that belonged to my first wife, which I bequeath to my children by my first wife; Dudley Darius and Druscilla, excepting Rufus from further portion of beddings or clothing as he has already rec'd his portions.

(Several more tracts of lands listed) The lands entered in the name of Dudley H.? Coopers name.. (involves about 560 acres) this to be made into equal division between all my children as they come of age or do desire such division.. Rufus, Druscilla, Dudley, Darius, Leonidas, Robert, John, Gamabill?? (No commas??)

Executor; son Dudley H. Cooper, to carry out the provisions after the death of my wife or her remarriage..the bedding acquired after my second marriage to be divided among my children by her, Leonidas, Robert, John and Gambrill this to be equally divided among them at the death of Nancy Hancock the widow of John Hancock

Executors to take charge of my slaves Sam and Charles.. Sam to retain and Charles to dispose of for a negro girl for the farm to remain in the home to assist my wife and Druscilla.. The slave Nelly from the estate of John Hancock, which as administrator of the estate I am empowered to free Nelly by the request of the widow and heirs of that estate, and while s Nelly lives she to be supported from my property with every necessary comfort and attention. Nelly to be freed at the death of Nancy Hancock.

33 Last Will of William Hocker..

To wife Sarah Hocker slaves a boy named Logan about age 18 years; a girl names Hagar about age 12 years and 1/3rd part of all my lands , 1 horse, saddle and bridle, 1 cow and calf, 2 beds, bedsteads and suffucient bedding with reasonable portion of household furniture and 1 years provisions. After the above division, my son James Hocker will have 2 shares of the balance of all my property, the other share he shall keep in custody for my son Parkerson Hocker and shall dispose of it as he thinks proper.

Should he die any property shall be given to his heirs with the exception of Napoleon, the son of Parkerson and his wife Hannah Miller.. the child Napoleon and it's mother I do debar from any interest in my estate. Or any part left in the care of my son James for my son Parkerson, if any reamins at the death of Parkerson and he leaves no other heirs except the son Napoleon, then that surplus to Parkersons brothers and sisters.

My son William to take the negro woman Cate and to be allowed for her care of her during her natural life and after this William to have his share

Of my estate.

My daughter Eliza Jane Litteral shall take a negro woman Jane, upon the same terms as William has and she to have equal balance of my estate. Equal share to daughters, Verlinda Turner and Nancy Long, Polly Woods, Minerva Todd.. daughter Angeline Reynolds now dec'd, her children to have a share.. at the death of my wife all to be divided among the children excepting Parkersons share as before directed

Executors; James and William Hocker (sons)

Codicil:: (Changes his mind) If Parkerson leaves no other heirs except the son Napoleon, then he shall inherit when he is age 21 years..if he is not living then back to the brothers and sisters of Parkerson.

Owen Rawlins is appointed as executor of my estate...to Thomas Cunningham the rent of my farm (~~exclude~~ the word rent, he to have the farm for 1 year) from the 1st of March 1850, provided he cultivate it himself.

Codicil.. after reading the will I find I need to amned, as I have set my negroes free with no support, I feel it my duty, they are to have one years provisions that they may have a chance to live.

The codicil was added 6 September 1849.. James Wilson, David Crawley and John - Stapp.

John Bastin and James Wilson two of the witnesses appeared..8 Oct. 1849.

John M. Stapp another witness appeared 11 October 1849.

Executor is William Grady, security is John V. Bastin and James Wilson.

51 John Jackson..Will.. executor appointed William P. Jackson 13 Oct.1849.

The Last Will of John Jackson..

To wife Susan Jackson, I give all my clothing and provisions provided for the family which may be in hand.. she also to have during her widowhood or natural life, real estate and personal property, the home farm upon which I live situated near the town of Fayette 600 acres..my three slaves Lewis, Ambrose and George..all the female slaves that I own of every age..all the household and kitchen furniture, work oxen, wagon, farming utensils, six head of horses, 10 cows and calves, 30 head of sheep.

Son Milton G. Jackson is to have 930.00 for the sole use of my daughter Permelia Rogers wife of Ebenezer Rogers, the interest money to be paid to her for her sole use..after her death to the heirs of her body.

Son Milton to have 1,000.00 in trust for Minerva Morrison wife of Alfred w. Morrison, this for her sole and separate use...daughters not to stand in need.

To my son Prior M. Jackson lands(description) 80 acres, he also to have wifes share created by this will (description) at her death...after the death of Prior the land shall descend unto his children. If none then the lands revert back to brothers.

Milton G. Jackson has already rec'd a tract of land in Chariton County 160 acres.

To son Abel R. Jackson after my wifes death that tract known as the Holliday Tract which was purchased of Dandridge Holliday in about 1837.

This land shall descend unto his heirs same as the provisions for Prior.

William P. Jackson (son) Lands (description) about 40 acres, and after my wifes death the home farm near Fayette. This excepting the 70 acres already given to Prior. William has the same descend as the others.

To grandchildren Martha Ann Jackson and John A. Jackson and Susan Jackson children of my deceased son Gabriel Jackson.. 600.00 to be divided among them.

If Ebenezer Rankin natural son of Jane Rankin of Howard County be living, and under the age of 12 years at my death, he is to have 100.00 to assist in educating him.

After wifes death, the slaves to be hired out until the amount of hire reaches their appraised value then the slaves are to be emancipated and sent to Africa, should any of the slaves be unwilling to go to Africa they are to be sold.

(Very lengthy instructions as to disposal and paying of estates)
Executors; wife Susan and son William P. Jackson as sole executors.
Signed; 29 September 1845..
Witnesses; George W. Ward and Weston J. Birch
Codicil; The crops, excess wheat, hemp and tobacco.. wife to take what is necessary and the excess to be added to the executors funds.. after the slaves reach their value in hire if there is no colonization society to provide transportation back to Africa, the slaves shall remain to be hired out until provisions can be made...21 June 1849.
The witnesses appeared the 11 October 1849.
William P. Jackson as principal, John A. Talbott, George W. Ward and John P. Sebree as security, \$30,000.00 bond..
